If any of the above problems occurs, the alarm lamp on the front panel will light and output current will be automatically turned off to protect and extend the equipment using life.

Device is equipped with a two-roll welding wire feeder and 1kg/100mm holder spool. MIG welding torch and the earth clamp are permanently installed.

SPARTUS® EasyMIG 125 will work both outdoors and in the field thanks to its small dimensions and the possibility of welding with a self-shielding wire without gas.
